

MELISSA'S TESTIMONY

Though we are a young program, the work of our volunteers has already paid off with wonderful stories of how God has used them to help others.

Here is Melissa's story:

On June 10, 2008, I found myself at rock bottom, sitting in a jail cell. My life had been in a downward spiral during the 6 previous months. I lost my house, job, custody of my daughter, car, and my freedom. This was all due to drug addiction which led to the extremely poor choices I made. I spent the summer in jail. When I arrived I was full of anger, bitterness, and, most of all, hopelessness. This would all soon change after signing up for a class called Personal Insight, which I signed up for

to pass the time. This class was taught by two loving, Christ-filled women, who volunteered their time and were an inspiration to me. The Personal Insight class opened my eyes and heart to Christ. While in jail I was saved and had an overwhelming thirst and hunger for the Lord for the first time in my life. I spent most of my time studying the Bible and gaining an intimate relationship with Jesus Christ. I am happy to say that I am now clean and sober. God has blessed me more than I could ever imagine since my released from jail.

I have my daughter back, unconditional love and support from my family, my car, and I just started a new job. The Lord led me and my family to a church and ten of us were baptized there a couple of weeks ago. I am so blessed not to have left my relationship with Christ on the doorstep of the jail when I was released. I love life now. It isn't perfect, but with Christ I am thankful to be alive each and every day. I can get through each day knowing there is always hope. I remind myself daily, "...with God all things are possible" (Matthew 19:26).
