Donations to our ministry can now be made online at <u>www.100hour.org</u>. Our main expense and major obstacle to expansion is providing free lesson books for each inmate or client in our groups. Our clients cannot afford them, and our groups are not very successful without them. We have tried without books, and it did not work. The lack of books discouraged participation by both facilitators and group members. We do not encourage photocopying loose pages. We feel that our intense program is effective and worth the effort of raising the funds so that the incarcerated, homeless, and needy have their own personal, high-quality books to write in.

### New Dating and Marriage Unit in Progress

Dr. Pratt is currently writing a 9 lesson series written especially for the incarcerated, homeless, and needy. It will emphasize basic Biblical truths that we want our clients to know in this special area that trips up so many. The nine tentative lessons are Sex, Love, Husbands, Wives, Submission, Fighting Fair, Commitment, Selfishness, and Unequally Yoked. The first three lessons have already been written.

#### Testimonies, Testimonies, Testimonies

Here are some happenings reported to us within the last few weeks. In the third lesson of **Insight**, a guard asked our facilitator to talk privately. Our facilitator led this person to the Lord. The person reporting this to us said "isn't Insight amazing!". An inmate was so impressed with the **Anger** unit that he wrote an elaborate thank you and testimony about the effect it had on his life. A number of people have decided to kick out their unmarried roommates and wait until marriage as a result of our pilot **Dating and Marriage** course. Our Parenting and Anger courses continue to be accepted for parole and supervision requirements as well as to regain the custody of children.

### A Message from President Don Pratt



Our records show that nearly 1,100 individuals have completed one of our units in the last year and a half. This represents over 15,000 student-hours of intense group interaction in 175 group sessions. None of this would be possible without incredible sacrifice by a large number of volunteers. Everyone in our organization is a volunteer right now. We even volunteer our own expenses and sometimes the materials needed for our own classes.

What can a person do to help us in our efforts? We have chosen the labor-intensive and formal-materials approach because it is effective. In so doing we face special challenges. It is hard to find the volunteers who will submit to the training required and to the rigor of a 5 to 12-week commitment. Our clients need the practical life skills training we bring. They need the interaction with us that we provide as well as the development of their problem solving and decision making skills which are based on faith and God's word. We could never do what we do without God's help and the help of our now-large community of 280 trained leaders, our sponsors, and our network of host institutions.
