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


Susan Sabino is 42nd Person to Complete the New "Dating and Marriage" Unit

Shown at left are Facilitator Don Batterman and Susan. Susan received her certificate on December 16 at Bradenton, FL at the Thursday Night Program held at Journey Church. She started coming on August 12 and has not missed a night since. Units completed include Personal Insight, Parenting 101, and Dating and Marriage.

The Dating and Marriage Unit became available in February and was written by FIT President, Dr. Don Pratt. It qualifies for "Area 5: Relationships" credit toward the FIT Complete Program Certificate. To graduate, participants must complete 100 contact hours of small-group interaction under the guidance of a FIT-trained facilitator. Also, at least one unit must be completed from each of the focus areas:

Comments from FIT facilitator Beverly Shatterly: When we start a program the men do not want to see it end. At Okaloosa CI the men said "we are sorrowful because we know when we finish this reentry curriculum we won't have the church family atmosphere anymore. When we come to this class, we feel a part of something. We have never been free to open up in this way before". Most of these men have been to at least 4 studies in the set of FIT books.

We have just finished the Dating and Marriage class at Jackson Work Camp. I thought at first that the men would resent or not pay attention to a woman facilitating a class like this. As we progressed I realized that they were able to get feedback from a woman's perspective and quite a few eyes began to see how important it is to listen to and try to understand their mate. All the men were very respectful and never said anything out of the way. They all agreed at the end to honor their wives by staying pure from outside influences or future mates by signing the commitment of staying pure till marriage and only marry or date anyone who can share the faith that God has given them. **That was a beautiful moment**.

Great newsletter. I truly enjoyed reading it and being able to empathize with the young gentleman and with you. I remember what it was like when I got out of the county jail. I had done 6 months in there, came out with no job, no money, *no* place to stay, no friends, no family to speak of, no transportation, unpaid fines, current fines and 5 years felony probation. You know once you get into the system it is so hard to get out. But God saw me through all of that and here I am sitting here writing this to you. I didn't have God in my life then but He never left me. Thank you Lord. Thank God for our trials and our tribulations. They have made me who I am today.

This is why I have such a passion for substance abuse addicts. I was addicted to crack cocaine for 14 years and have been drug free for 15 years. Back then I never thought that would be possible but look at God. **He** made it all possible for me -- I couldn't do it.

Satan tried to hold me down by always making me remember my past. He would place doubt in my mind, (i.e. you know you can't do that, your daughter doesn't trust you or love you, you will lose that job too, etc.) With forgiveness from God, and finally being able to forgive myself because of His forgiveness, I don't have to let my past mistakes hold me down anymore. My past is my past. All I can say now is, "I've been there, done that, and I am not going back, with the help of the Lord". Praise the Lord! My favorite scripture is Philippians 4: 13 I can do all things through Christ which strengthens me.

One thing I had to realize in my mind was that it would take a while, (this took years) for me to restore the trust back from those that I had lied to for so many years and not let that bother me. I just had to show them I meant what I said by my actions. Once again, my word is my bond! People do trust me now. If I say I am going to do something, I do it. Commitment. Satan's job is to kill, steal and destroy. Well, he stole, over those 14 years addicted, everything from me that meant the world to me. I am happier now with my life, in helping others that are going through the same things that I experienced, than I have ever been before. HOPE!!! Anything is possible through Christ.
