Joe has agreed to head up the new Pioneering Committee to be presented at the next Board Meeting.




Board Member and Founder Ed White will be working with an inmate at Zephyrhills Correctional to certify him as a “peer facilitator”. Peer facilitators graduate from the complete program as a client, receive mentoring from a FIT trainer, and obtain recommendations from the officials of their facility. They then work with the local chaplain to conduct classes, and to order materials and certificates of completion. Ed and **Board Member Fred DeMouey** will also be going to Tallahassee, FL this month to present in a case before the Florida Clemency Board. On their way they will do groundwork in setting up classes in prisons new to FIT.



Board Member Joe Sheehan has agreed to head up the new Curriculum Committee if adopted at the next board meeting. Joe and **Board Members John Woods and Don Pratt** rewrote the former



Parenting 101 course. The new course is called *Practical Parenting*. It has nine two-hour lessons for a total of 18 hours. Joe has also begun work on a new course called *Reality, Repen-*



tance, and Restoration.

Board Member Ted Gaines continues his work at the DeSoto Correctional Institution in Arcadia, FL and the Charlotte Correctional Institution in Punta Gorda, FL, and he needs help. These facilities are within reasonable driving distance for facilitators from Bradenton-Sarasota, Ft. Myers, Lakeland, and South-Central Florida. If you can help, please call Ted at 239-771-4924. Board Members Don Pratt, Ellie Larson, and Suzanne Wilson continue to upgrade the ac-



countability and client-reporting systems used with courts, officers, and judges. The local group in Bradenton, FL meet monthly to improve facilitation in the “Thursday night program”. Four different

courses are concurrently offered by a team of up to a dozen facilitators in the classroom annex of Journey Assembly of God.

Board Member Donald Carter is lead pastor of Journey Assembly of God and provides support and encouragement. The church contributes to FIT as a missions project, buys all the books that facilitators from the church use, and leases office space for \$1 per year. *-More board member profiles next issue.-*
