from the desk of President Don Pratt:

John 20:15-17. When they had finished eating, Jesus said to Simon Peter, "Simon son of John, do you love me more than these?" "Yes, Lord," he said, "you know that I love you." Jesus said, "Feed my lambs." Again Jesus said, "Simon son of John, do you love me?" He answered, "Yes, Lord, you know that I love you." Jesus said, "Take care of my sheep." The third time he said to him, "Simon son of John, do you love me?" He said to him, "Simon son of John, do you love me?" He said, "Lord, you know all things; you know that I love you." Jesus said, "Feed my sheep."

If we love Jesus, we are to take His words and mission seriously, not just give it lip service. Our mission is to show our love by showing love and concern for the needs of His people.

It is significant that Jesus asked Peter if he loved him three times. Peter had already denied him that many times and three is used in the Bible as showing special emphasis. Hot-tempered John, the "son of thunder", was to become the apostle of love. Jesus had changed him and he was to get past his past and move on a profoundly changed man. He would write five books of the Bible. Four of the five would have the themes of "God's love" and "brotherly love".

When I moved away from Florida in the 1980s I was determined to never come back. There was too much crime, too much prejudice, and too many people who did not share my values. Be careful about your attitude because I was led right back here to love the poor and disadvantaged. It was then that I came to understand them better and their needs. They were people who were not used to being loved or having anyone listen to them. They were people of little power and could not help me climb the social ladder. I had to climb down to them and help them climb a little higher.

Then I found that they started to respond to me and that I would become a leader among like-minded people who wanted to serve Jesus in the same way.

Being loved means everything. It is universal. It has been proven that babies can actually die if their physical needs are met but they are not handled and shown connection.

We show our love to others by listening. By caring. By praying. By supporting their ministry.
