is no exception.


"Life skills", as we define them, are personal skills that will make us successful in society. They include anger management, parenting. dating and marriage, grief and addiction management, financial stability, forgiveness,

restitution, and good citizenship.

These skills are important in both the secular and religious communities and are what FIT focuses on. The two communities do not always trust each other, though, and FIT faces additional challenges because of it.

There are many in the secular community who want no part of anything religious. One person told me that all-secular programs are the best because then everybody can benefit from them. This, of course, excludes spiritual material that many people want in their program. For the record, FIT does not "cram anything down anyone's throat". It is a Christian program that people of other faiths or no faith sometimes elect to take and are welcome to get out of it what they can. And they do.

One basis of our motto is the personal actualization of becoming all that you can become. This applies to both secular society and the religious community. In short, you become a better Christian by being a better citizen and you become a better citizen by becoming a better Christian. The graphic at the right shows some of these common features.





In our last Newsletter, we detailed our history in obtaining approval to operate our program in state and local government facilities. This approval is especially important to us because we are almost totally dependent on these facilities to let

us in to minister to the needs of our clients. The great majority of our clients are in public institutions such as prisons and jails. Even the non-public facilities are affected because their clients need to satisfy conditions of parole and court orders handed down at the time of sentencing and these often include courses that we offer, such as anger management and parenting.

Due to our status of being a religious organization serving a secular purpose, we sometimes have approval to offer our programs to clients on a voluntary basis. As mentioned last month, this status changes by agency and institution and within them from time to time.

We are pleased to announce that FIT has received official notification from Johnny Frambo, Chaplaincy Services Administrator, of the Florida Department of Corrections, with the following citation:

"Family Integrity Training (FIT) is a wonderful program and has always been offered in Chaplaincy programming"
