The Inside Out Network (ION), a non-profit that connects people leaving incarceration with ministries and service providers who want to help them, is undertaking a broad survey of what's happening in congregation-based reentry ministry. Their goal is to gather insights from churches of various sizes and geographical locations and then create a practical how-to guide, "Effective Reentry Ministry for Ordinary Congregations," that will empower more churches to engage in reentry ministry in a way that fits them.

Your input will be a real blessing to the many churches out there that want to minister with and to returning citizens who need some help getting started.

Shipping prices have gone up several times in the last year as well as the length of time to receive it. This affects our office efficiency in our efforts to provide you with first-class service.



Please let us and the post office know your address change. When submitting a forwarding address form to the post office, send one to your old post office and another to your new post office about a week later. This will usually eliminate any problems you have. Also, be aware that the Post Office only forwards your mail for 6 months from one address to another.

When requesting books for a new class, order at least 2 1/2 weeks in advance. Certificates are shipped first class and we do our best to get them out to you by the next day; however, there are times when we may not get them out until the 3rd day.

We can make flyers that may be used to promote your class. Would you like us to make something like that to post in your ministry location? If so, give us the details you want on the flyer and we will print, laminate, and mail an 8-1/2x11 poster to you. Allow plenty of time for us to prepare it for you.

Dead Time



While facilitating a class at one of the Correctional Institutions (CIs), one of our students mentioned that there were several inmates that were doing “dead time”. Not hearing that term before, I asked what dead time meant. The inmate replied that a prisoner not taking any classes or trying to improve themselves and were just marking off the days until release was dead timing.

That made sense to me. As I thought about it, there could be dead timing Christians, who have accepted Christ as their savior, but haven’t gotten into the Word, joined a church, or become a part of a Sunday School class. Maybe they go on Sundays, but leave Christianity as soon as the leave church.

As facilitators, we have a responsibility to make sure that we aren’t creating dead timers in our groups. We must not preach. We need to set expectations. We are aiming for a fully interactive class. We must not judge or grade what they say!

We can make sure that we interact with them, talk with them and find out where they call home. Do they have a nickname? Positively comment on what that made you think about after they responded. Had you ever thought about that? Bring back a memory from the last class. Be as transparent as possible. If you aren’t, why should they?
