



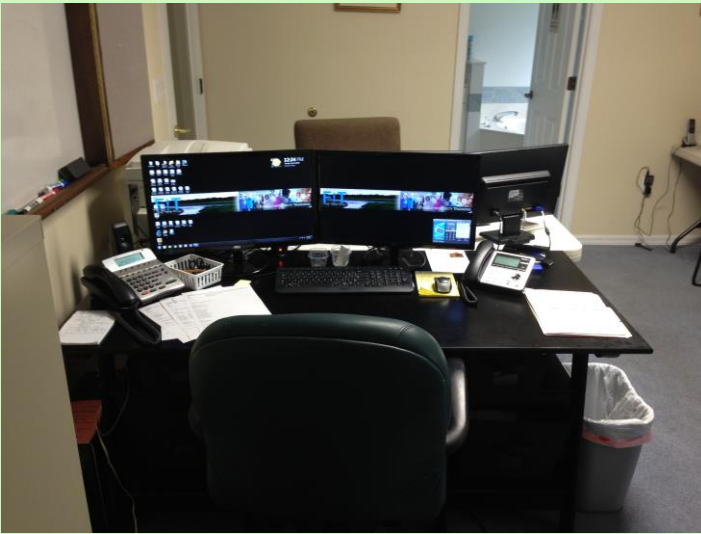
FIT TRAINS NEW LEADERS AT THE SALVATION ARMY IN PANAMA CITY, FL

FIT OPENS NEW OFFICE IN BRADENTON, FL - new address 5017 37th ST E, 34203



After several years of running out of the house of President Don Pratt, the FIT office has now been relocated to space generously provided by Don's home church. This includes an office area (upper left), three walk-in storage closets (example, upper right), and a production area (bottom left). FIT's curriculum is a combination of two publishers - Living Free/Turning Point of Chattanooga, Tennessee and FIT of Bradenton, FL. FIT prints its own materials in-house. FIT began in 2005 when Founder Ed White set up a prison committee when he was men's director of his denomination's district office in Lakeland, FL. Fueled by a \$25,000 grant, prisoners in local jails and prisons were provided the books for the initial courses. After a few

years, the funds ran out and FIT nearly closed. Don Pratt took over office operations and in 2010, Florida Integrity Training was incorporated as a separate 501(c)3 nonprofit corporation. Last year contributions and income built back up to the \$25,000 level, but this was not enough to fund an office. In the past several years, FIT has been able to provide free course materials and customized certificates for nearly all of its 6879 graduates due to the great generosity of FIT facilitators and board members who pay dues, contribute out of their own pockets, and work and travel for nothing.
